About Dr. Daniel Gordis

For decades, Israel's enemies have sought to destroy her. They have tried to accomplish this goal with standing Arab armies, economic boycotts and relentless terrorism. In recent years a new strategy has emerged – the strategy of de-legitimizing Israel in the international arena. As one of Israel's most outspoken scholars and engaging speakers, Dr. Daniel Gordis has been leading the charge against Israel's de-legitimization. Since moving to Israel in 1998, Dr. Gordis has written and lectured throughout the world on Israeli society and the challenges facing the Jewish state. His writings have appeared in numerous publications including the New York Times, the New Republic and the Jerusalem Post. Dr. Gordis was the founding dean of the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies at the University of Judaism, the first rabbinical college on the West Coast. He is Senior Vice President of the Shalem Center, Israel's first liberal arts college. He joined the Shalem Center in 2007 after spending nine years as vice president of the Mandel Foundation in Israel and director of its Leadership Institute.
